Regular City Commissioner Meeting Minutes, Crab Orchard City Hall August 2, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 by Mayor Billy R. Shelton, Mayor Shelton led the invocation.

Role call was performed by City Clerk; all were present for meeting.

Last month's meetings minutes were reviewed and no changes needed to be made, Commissioner Keith Saylor, made the motion to accept last month's minutes as stand, 2nd by Commissioner Chris Sandlin, all in favor, motion carried.

Financial report was given by City Clerk (see attached), no changes need to be made, and Commissioner Juanita Pettit, made the motion to accept as stand, 2nd by Commissioner Keith Saylor, all in favor, motion carried.

Commissioner Reports

City Commissioner Jerry Shelton stated the Ambulance Board received their monies to distribute which was approximately \$350 k dollars this was more than in the past they had received. He also invited people of the community to attend the Ambulance Board meetings they are held on the 3rd Monday of each month at 7:00 pm.

Several residents expressed their concerns against the Wet/Dry vote and had issues with the fact that the city will not be receiving any taxes towards the sale of alcohol. They stated it was a sorry way to build the city. The constable had also expressed concerns with all the stores that had gambling machines in them and the city needed to address those.

Attorney John Hackley stated the city cannot collect directly off of alcohol sales since we were formally a 6^{th} class city when the statues where changed in 2015m but here is a potential the stated will change this statue at the next legislative session and this is discriminatory against the smaller class cities.

Concern was raised regarding the weeds growing around the street signs and telephone poles and residents that needs to mow yard.

No other business to discuss Commissioner Juanita Pettit made the motion to adjourn the meeting 2nd by Chris Sandlin all in favor motion carried, meeting adjourned at 7:49 pm.

City of Crab Orchard Ordinance #18-07-12 Water/Wastewater Rate Ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CRAB ORCHARD, KENTUCKY:

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City of Crab Orchard, Kentucky to increase water and sewer rates due to the rise in raw water cost, the new water lines, raw sewage treatment cost, and operating and maintance costs: the City of Crab Orchard, Kentucky does hereby amend the rates presently being charged.

SECTION 1: The City of Crab Orchard does hereby adopt the following schedule of rates to be charged for water, to with:

SECTION 2: The City of Crab Orchard does hereby adopt the Kentucky River Fee at a rate of \$0.27 per thousand gallons of water used.

SECTION 3: The City of Crab Orchard does hereby adopt the following schedule of rates to be charged for wastewater, to wit:

First 1,000 gallons for customers Every thousand gallons thereafter

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall become effective on the 12th day of July 2018, after its 2nd passage and upon Publication.
