Regular City Commissioner Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 6:31 by Mayor Billy R. Shelton. Mayor Shelton led the invocation.

Roll call was performed by City Clerk; all were present for meeting,

Last month's meetings minutes were reviewed and Commissioner Jerry Shelton stated need to make one correction to page one, paragraph 5 change the word "not" to "now". Commissioner Keith Saylor, made the motion to accept last month's minutes as stand, 2nd by Commissioner Chris Sandlin, all in favor, motion carried.

Financial report was given by City Clerk (see attached), no changes need to be made, and Commissioner Juanita Pettit, made the motion to accept as stand, 2nd by Commissioner Chris Sandlin, all in favor, motion carried.

Commissioner Reports

City Commissioner Jerry Shelton stated the Ambulance service living quarters has been deemed unsafe to live in and will need to be updated before the 24 hour staff can stay at the building. Spoke with KLC Attorney Chris Johnson regarding the budget and he has offered to come down and set up a workshop with the Commission if we so desire.

Water/Wastewater Commissioner, Keith Saylor stated we have purchased 3.8 million gallons of water and sold 2.2 million gallons for a difference of 1.5 million. Water loss is 33%. We still have more leaks and we need to try to detect the leaks. Maybe Rural Water can assist with that. Had a meeting in Frankfort with the Division of Water regarding the violations. They have reviewed them and have specific guidelines and have set a timeframe in order for the necessary repairs and orders to be completed. If these are not completed in a timely fashion a penalty of \$1000.00 per day could be assessed if not completed before the deadline. Their recommendation was to impose a \$12000.00 fine and we will have to respond to that with a counter offer. We may need to review our current water and sewer rates to ensure they are in line to pay the necessary fines and possible repairs. We also need to pull the man hole covers to check the levels in hope to locate the water loss we are experiencing.

Emergency Services Commissioner, Chris Sandlin reported that Police Chief Jimmy Gipson has 12 drug arrests alone for the past month and that was very impressive. Police Chief Jimmy Gipson gave detail account of his monthly activity (see attached).

Streets and Roads Commissioner, Juanita Pettit reported a street light out at 1331 Walnut. No word on an update from Luther Galloway in regards to the sidewalk project. She has been in touch with the state in regards to road aid funding and we no longer receive from the state but from the Department of Local Government and the amounts should be for 2015 \$16,741, 2016 \$16,898 and 2017 \$10,207. These funding will be sent as soon as the UFIR's are completed. These will be completed one the audit is finished.

New Business, after a discussion with City Attorney, John Hackley the city has decided to follow suit with Stanford and Hustonville in the law suit against the Fiscal Court in with the 911 service fee to be attache4d to the water meters. Commissioner Chris Sandlin made the motion to participate with the other 2 cities Stanford and Hustonville to file suit against the Fiscal Court, 2nd by Commissioner Keith Saylor all in favor, motion carried.

March 1, 2018

The Christmas Lights needs to be taken down ASAP, two members of the Fire Dept have offered to take down the lights and the city will pay them to do so.

The mowing of the cities properties needs to be reviewed. Commissioner Chris Sandlin made the motion to bid out the mowing, 2nd by Commissioner Keith Saylor, vote was, Commissioners Sandlin, Pettit, Saylor and Mayor Shelton- yea and Commissioner Jerry Shelton nae, motion carried.

The Easter Egg hunt will be held April 7 providing there is no inclement weather, we also will be having the Easter coloring contest for the Crab Orchard Elementary School children. One winner from each class will be chosen.

Commissioner Keith Saylor stated in order to simplify things he feels we should do away with the water clerk position and combine the two positions Water Clerk and City Clerk and the pay to be divided 40% from the Water and 60% from the City funds. After a discussion the other Commissioners did not think this was the best option. The hiring of someone full time to assist Devon is necessary at the present time. The Water Commissioner is to interview applicants this week.

Commissioner Chris Sandlin made the motion to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Commission Keith Saylor all in favor, motion carried, and meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm.
