Regular City Commissioner Meeting Minutes Crab Orchard City Hall June 3, 2021 6:30 pm

The meeting was called to order at 6:34 by Mayor Billy R. Shelton, Commissioner Bill Dyehouse, led the invocation and Mayor Shelton led the pledge of allegiance to the US flag.

Role call was performed by City Clerk; all was present, Mayor Shelton established there was a quorum.

May 2021 meetings minutes were reviewed and no changes needed to be made, Commissioner Kenneth Manuel made the motion to accept last month's minutes as stand, 2nd by Commissioner Bill Dyehouse, all in favor, motion carried.

Commissioner Reports:
