ORDINANCE 05-06-02 YARD SALE ORDINANCE

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the City of Crab Orchard, Kentucky that it is deemed desirable and necessary that yard and garage sales within the city be controlled so as to prevent proliferation of nuisances and the congestion of streets and public ways.

SECTION 1 DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

YARD SALE All sales generally known as "garage sales, lawn sales, attic sales, rummage sales, or yard sales".

GOODS. Any personal property capable of being the object of the sale regulated hereunder.

PERSON. Individuals, partnerships, voluntary associations and corporations.

SECTION 2 TIME LIMITATIONS;

- {A} No yard sale shall continue for a period of more than two consecutive days.
- {B} All unsold items shall be removed from public view at the end of the day on which the yard sale ends.

Violation of each of these provisions shall result in a penalty fine per violation. {Penalty, see Section 6}

SECTION 3 ADVERTISMENTS

All advertisements for yard sales shall be taken down within 24 hours from the end of the sale. Violation will result in a penalty fine.

{Penalty, see Section 6}

SECTION 4 SIDEWALK AREAS TO BE UNOBSTRUCTED.

All sidewalks or walk areas abutting on and in front of the property at which any yard or garage sale is being conducted, shall remain free and uncongested so as to allow normal passage of traffic, both pedestrian and motor vehicles. Violation will result in a penalty fine.

SECTION 5 FLEA MARKETS

Any person renting space to flea market sellers shall be required to purchase a business license from the City Clerk and pay a business license fee of \$25.00 per year.

{Penalty, see Section 6}

SECTION 6 PENALTY

First Reading June 2, 2005 Second Reading July 7,2005

Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$10.00 per violation. Each day a violation is allowed to continue shall constitute a new violation and fine.
